1 IN 6 OF US KNOW SOMEONE WHO IS OR HAS BEEN HOMELESS.

They're our family, friends, and classmates; they account for 403 members of our community, according to the 2014 Homeless Count (though the "on the ground" estimate is much higher). They increasingly include women and their children, youth, aboriginals, and seniors.

2014 HEROES OF THE HOMELESS

24 Fine Art Firsties students created and sold ceramic **Hearts for Hope**, raising \$970 in donations.

CORNERSTONE DROP-IN CENTRE

We granted \$20,000 to launch the only women's drop-in centre in Surrey, where Flo, who was hit by a truck and severely disabled, secured a walker and learned to walk again, inspiring other women with her determination and smiles.

In 2014, 67 women and their children were able to find housing with the help of the drop-in.



SURREY VULNERABLE WOMEN AND GIRLS WORKING GROUP

Our grant of \$6,420 went to research ways to better serve vulnerable women and girls in Surrey, and numerous women serving agencies. Additional funding of \$30,000.00 was obtained from the BC Ministry of Justice to execute research recommendations that will ultimately reduce the barriers to services and help vulnerable women and girls to live more healthy and productive lives.

In 2007, the City of Surrey allocated 9 million dollars from the City's Affordable Housing Reserve Fund to seed the Surrey Homelessness and Housing Fund. This was a response to the emerging trend of homelessness and lack of affordable housing in the City of Surrey.

The Fund, held at Vancity Community Foundation on behalf of the Surrey Homelessness and Housing Society, is an endowment that grows over time, allowing the Society to provide more funding through our grants to homelessness and housing solutions.
